School Safety



As of February 2019, over 2,242 tips have been reported to **Wyoming's** <u>Safe2Tell</u> app that lets students share anonymous safety concerns to schools and law enforcement. <u>The Casper Star Tribune</u> says the app transforms students into "first responders before the first responders" and is "a crucial piece in a broader puzzle of school safety."
