FAFSA

The New York State Education Department launched a new interactive online FAFSA Tracker developed by Data Insight Part to track FAFSA completion rates at high schools across the state.

Teacher Recruitment and Retention

The **Arkansas** Department of Education celebrated Educator Commitment Signing Week by hosting more than 20 events around the state to celebrate individuals committed to the teaching profession and education. These signing day events are part of the Teach Arkansas campaign to increase teacher recruitment and retention.

School Improvement

Education Commission of the States researched K-12 school improvement practices in all 50 states and the District of Columbia to provide this resource on turnaround strategies across the nation.

Equity

CCSSO released States Leading: Promising Practices Advancing the Equity Commitments 2019, which provides snapshots of states' practices and policies that create a more equitable education for all students.

ESSA

ExcelinEd released a series of ESSA playbooks to provide state policymakers clear recommendations, practical advice, and resources for school interventions.

Collaboration

At the Hunt Institute's 2019 Education Retreat: Advancing Cross-State Conversations, state leaders examined key education priorities, including supporting college completion, coordinating early learning services, and developing a pipeline of highly qualified school leaders.

Conditions for Learning

CCSSO produced a series of resources on social and emotional learning and strengthening conditions for student learning, including one that examines key opportunities ESSA presents to states to advance social and emotional learning and development, as well as one that reflects on what improving those conditions looks like in practice and provides promising examples where states have taken action to maximize academic outcomes for students.

Equity

The Hill published How states are leading the way on educational equity, an op-ed written by Pedro Rivera, Pennsylvania's Secretary of Education and CCSSO's newest Board President. Rivera describes how the nation's state school leaders have shared promising practices to deliver an equitable education to all students.

Social-Emotional Learning

NASBE's latest policy update, <u>Gauging</u> Support for Social and Emotional Skill **Building**, takes a deep dive into a survey of community influencers in Connecticut, Illinois, Kansas, Michigan, and Washington on how they understand and support the embedding of social and emotional learning in K-12 instruction.
